There are many ways to watch free movies online, but not all of them are legal or safe. Additional guides to big players Sony Crackle, Crackle, or Crackle Plus When known simply as Crackle, this free streaming site has been through almost as many name changes as Mr Diddy. Originally controlled by Sony, it is now a joint venture between Sony and Chicken Soup Soul Entertainment (CSS). This partnership created a new entity, Crackle Plus, and it was thought that it would also become the name of the streaming service. But one look at the site and obviously the simplicity won: It's just called Crackle. What you call it, the service includes content from six ad-supported CSS streaming services (Popcornflix, Popcornflix Kids, Popcornflix Comedy, Frightpix, EspaÑolflix and Truli), as well as some Sony movies and television shows. You'll find quite a few blockbuster hits like Speed, Transporter, and Close Encounters of the Third Kind, and generously smattering obscure but exciting B-movies. Crackle is a great resource, although constant breaks from advertisers can get old pretty quickly. The service is offered in 21 countries, but has closed with donations from Canada, Latin America and Australia. IMDb TV Newer in this roundup is amazon-owned IMDb TV (formerly known as Freeview). It includes free, ad-supported TV shows and movies. In February 2020, the service gained rights to more than 20 Disney-owned series, including Lost, Desperate Housewives, Malcolm In the Middle, and My So-Called Life. This is also the only site that allows you to stream Lost and Malcolm in the middle for free. Other TV shows in its relatively small library include Fringe, Heroes, Quantum Leap, and Court Files. Movies include Memento, La La Land, Drive, Monster, Donnie Darko, Dune, Illusionist, Zodiac, Clue, and more. You can watch IMDb TV on the web, Amazon Fire devices and Apple TV, and through the Amazon Prime app, which you can find on most smart TVs, tablets and phones. IMDb TV is in the US only now, although European development is in the works. Vudu Walmart-owned Vudu may be better known for its subscription streaming service, but the platform also has an impressive and free advertising supported content section. Names like Escort, 10,000 days, and offerings are good examples of what you'll find. If you take a cruise through the site selection of 4K/HDR titles, there are even one or two free-to-watch options. This is a deal when you use Hoopla, a digital media streaming platform that collaborates with local libraries to allow members to access content borrowed online. It's similar to Overdrive, but with more than just ebooks and audiobooks. The availability of any name will depend on your location and the number of copies that can be downloaded, but we found some surprisingly decent flicks when we checked out in August 2020. Streaming will work on any browser device, and downloads are required on the Hoopla app's mobile device. Not every library currently supports Hoopla, so make sure you ask. So far, libraries in the United States and Canada have access to Hoopla. YouTube this is a no-brainer. Everyone knows that YouTube is the largest video hosting service on the internet, and you're probably already using the site for stupid cat videos and footage of people getting hit with exercise balls. It not only hosts free movies on demand, but it's also a free live-TV streaming service, hosting content curated from all over the Internet. Although the channels vary wildly, we've focused here on movies. Pluto TV currently has many live movie channels, perfect if you want to watch something, but do not know what. There are two general purpose cinema channels, and the rest is focused on specific genres or categories, including action films, Flicks of Fury, Horror 24/7, Classic Films, Black Cinema, Gravitas Films, and Asylum. The service operates in the USA as well as in many international places. Pluto's TV on-demand movie library is quite small and rotating often, but offers just as diverse as its live movie channels. The service is currently available as a free app for iOS and Android, but it is also compatible with various Roku devices, Kindles and many other streaming devices. The main site is also wind surf. The site is updated weekly with featured horror classics, which are later available for free download as WMV files to the site's Snack Bar.
